\*1- Class assignments are determined by students' proficiency level. Please register for the designated class.

\*2- As for the Foreign Language Courses, students are required to learn Japanese. However, for those who are acknowledged by university to have reached a certain level of Japanese language skills at the time of entrance, the Foreign Language Courses are not compulsory. In that case, they need to acquire an additional 2 credits or more from the Upper Division Liberal Arts Courses (See 3.5). However, in that case, the required subtotal credits from the Liberal Arts Courses is still the same (31 credits or more).

\*3- Organized and offered by other faculties except the Faculty of Sustainability Studies.

\*4- Students are not allowed to register for Japanese language classes in ESOP (Exchange Students from Overseas Program).

\*5- Non-accredited courses are included in the International Volunteer & International Internship Programs. Please contact the Global Education Center for further information.

\*6- The upper limit of the allowable attainment of ERP (English Reinforcement Program) is 4 credits.

#### 3.2.1 Total Credits Required to Graduate

*Total Credits Required to Graduate* means the necessary number of credits for a student to acquire to
